Village of Cleveland Regular Meeting 6:30PM February 9, 2021

PRESENT: Mayor Laureen Tackman, Trustees John Scatena and Dave Donovan. Trustees Eric Cartier and Robin Wilson were absent. No members of the public were in attendance.

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER by Mayor Tackman at 6:30 pm with Pledge of Allegiance.

Since there were no members of the public present for public comment, Mayor Tackman made a motion to pay Abstract #9, vouchers 388-425 for \$31,616.91, and Voucher # 8 for the Water Project for \$40,299.02 second by Trustee Scatena, all in favor. Mayor Tackman made a motion to approve the following budget modifications as presented, second by Trustee Donovan, all in favor.

FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT: Trustee Donovan read the report submitted by the fire department:

Last month, we responded to a total of 30 calls. Of those calls there were twenty-one EMS calls, two hazardous condition calls, and one call in which we responded mutual aid. Our firehouse was still shut down last month due to COVID. We allowed a limited number of members in for non-emergency activity such as station maintenance and vehicle maintenance. Last week the chief and company president decided to open the firehouse back up. We will have our monthly meeting at the firehouse but still offer it on Zoom. Weekly drills will start as of tomorrow at the firehouse. Social distancing, mask wearing, screening etc. will still be adhered to.

Much of our membership has been through both rounds of COVID vaccines. We had two members who will be getting their first shots this coming week.

Assistant Chief Bill James has been working with CNY EMS and our medical director to get our agency cleared to carry more ems drugs. This past month he got us cleared to carry EPI Pens and blood glucose meters. Our apparatus along with our chiefs now carry EPI Pens, Albuterol, NARCAN, blood glucose meters and oral glucose. This is on top of the equipment we were already carrying which included AED's, airways and oxygen. This greatly increases our capabilities to care for patients.

The thermal imaging camera on the ladder truck stopped charging. The battery packs went bad as did the charger. The cost of new battery packs was \$350.00 each. We had them rebuilt for \$20.00 each at Interstate Batteries and the charger was repaired for less than \$100.00. The cost of a replacement camera would have been approximately \$1,500.00. We also purchased a lighter weight thermal imaging camera this month to put on the mini pumper. All three front line pieces of apparatus now carry handheld thermal imaging cameras and the officer's air packs on all three have smaller thermal imaging cameras build into their air packs.

Mayor Tackman stated that Trustees Cartier and Wilson are working on plans for the park for this year and will be working on a plan for new playground equipment this year. She has been in touch with the DEC and our engineers about dredging the pond on Bridge Street. Next meeting is March 9th at 6:30pm. Mayor Tackman made a motion at 7:02pm to adjourn the meeting, second by Trustee Donovan, all in favor.
