TUG HILL REPORT: Paul Baxter gave the following report:

The next meeting of the **North Shore Council of Governments** is scheduled for **Wednesday, October 30 at 7:00 p.m. at the West Monroe town hall**. One major agenda item will be a presentation by a representative of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation on upcoming changes to regulation of freshwater wetlands, changes which will substantially increase the amount of wetlands affected.

Highway

Highlander is expected soon to finish up the water project which includes
